NASHER MUSEUM PRESENTS EXHIBIT OF RICHARD MOSSE: THE ENCLAVE

Come see the amazing, immersive 40-minute six-channel video installation shot by Richard Mosse presented at the Nasher Museum of Art at Duke University. This body of work is being displayed for the first time in the Southeast. Make sure you hurry here because this exhibit will be closing Jan. 10, 2016.

After less than 40 minutes in the car, you can be immerse yourself in this beautiful yet haunting look into the civil war and humanitarian crises that have troubled this region of Africa for decades.

The Enclave features six double-sided screens installed in a dark room to create a fully immersive experience. This experience is designed to mimic eastern Congo's multifaceted conflict.

This exhibit is designed to move people and inform them of the horrors and conflict that are affecting many regions around the world.

Mosse's cinematographer Trevor Tweeten and composer Ben Frost experienced these conflicts by embedding themselves into armed rebel groups.

Through a unique technique of using infrared film developed by the military to reveal camouflaged installations hidden in the landscape and registering an invisible spectrum of light, the film becomes a vibrant pink.

Mosse is an incredibly skilled photographer who has had his work exhibited all across the world. He received the Deutsche Börse Photography Prize in 2014. Come out and enjoy his work while it is still close to you!

The Nasher Museum is a center for the arts at Duke University that opened in 2005. The museum presents leading edge exhibits that travel worldwide. The museum contains a contemporary collection that features a growing list of artists and strives to attain the highest level of artistic excellence.
